# Kids who Shout in Church

“Out of the mouths of babes” is a common phrase when a kid blurts out some honest words which everyone else is thinking, but perhaps too nervous to say. In His own way Jesus used those words in Matthew 21. When Jesus went to the temple

following His triumphal entry, He saw several things that grieved Him and several things that encouraged Him. First, He saw

hardened and selfish hearts (*i.e. people lying, cheating, and jealous of one another, using money for personal gain, abusing leadership roles, playing church, and neglecting the essentials of the faith – vs. 12-15*). Jesus was angry and disappointed. Prayer and praise were being overshadowed by power and preference. The second thing Jesus saw were innocent, well-intentioned, faith-conscious hearts of children shouting in the temple, declaring truth. Jesus was overjoyed. Through the lips

of children, He had seen and heard the heart of what being His follower was all about (v 16).

When

questioned about the noise and message of the children, Jesus quoted a portion of Psalm 8:2 “*From the lips of children and infants You have ordained praise because of Your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger.*” Basically Jesus declared, God has placed children and infants at the front of the battle. They have the capacity to

silence all who oppose Him. And deliverance will follow their lead. Jesus also said to His disciples, “*Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of Heaven belong to such as these.*” (Matthew 19:14).

First Brethren, I want to reinforce God's eternal call to train and encourage children who will lead us in sincere praise to God and assist in

winning the battle before us. It is not only right, but it is essential for us to strengthen and develop meaningful infant, children, and youth ministries. If God is willing to put them in the forefront, then so should we. I have been greatly encouraged by recent conversations regarding these kinds of ministries in the church. But successful, meaningful, transformational ministries such as these cannot rest on the shoulders of a few.

It is time that we as a whole congregation fully understand and fully embrace God's vision for the church. God has called us to

disciple people of all ages (*young and adult*) and reach out to a community in need by connecting with and teaching children and youth. If you are an older individual or younger and without kids, you are not excluded in this vision. First Brethren is committed to shepherding and discipling all people. You included. And you are needed to

carry out our evangelistic call of introducing kids to Jesus. If you know Jesus already you can be a part of seeing and making this happen, regardless of your age or your family structure.

On Mother's Day I presented many practical ways we can positively influence a child or student. Let us

seize this moment before us. Let us face the opportunities with anticipation rather than fear, face it with courage rather than distress. Remember, the Lord will fight for us, we need only to be still. (Ex 14:13-14) So stand firm my friends. His is an unshakable kingdom. And this house of His will stand - full of prayer and praise, and full of children's voices declaring His glory.

## A Man Prefers...

To be respected over being loved. According to Shaunti Feldhahn, author of *For Women Only*, if men had to choose between feeling alone & unloved and feeling inadequate & disrespected, 73.8% of them would chose alone/unloved. That's NOT the choice most women would make. But then it is no surprise (although sometimes frustrating!) that the genders think differently. Through a professional survey, Feldhahn offers the following comments made by men regarding respect and their wives\*:

- Don't question me in public.
- Don't point out my faults before telling me something good.
- Although desiring the respect of co-workers and others, "...having my wife's respect is the most important thing to me."
- When you talk down to me, it really makes me feel bad.
- I value your opinion but not always the tone in which it is delivered
- Listen to me and take my advice occasionally.
- Know where to draw the line when sharing information about us to others.
- Accept my compliments.
- Sometimes I do the same wrong things the children do, but please do not talk to me like I am a child
- Respect my opinion, especially in my area of expertise.

It is my belief that the relationship between a man and wife is a unique dance that has great potential for transforming us into God's image. I think it is by His design that male and

female, while both made in His image, are created to be different. Marriage can be a safe, secure environment in which to come face to face with our own sinful traits and learn servanthood and humility. No wonder marriage is difficult!

## He Knows What He's Doing

Before we hire someone to do something important for us, such as treating us for a serious physical problem, remodeling our home, or doing major repair work on our car, we'd like to be assured that the person knows what he (or she) is doing. We might want to talk to people who've hired this person to do work for them, to learn what the person's reputation is. The more good things we hear about the person, and the more convinced we become of his competence, the more confidence we'll have in retaining the person to help us.

God knows what He's doing. He's extremely competent in everything He does. That may sound so obvious that it doesn't even need to be said. But it has occurred to me lately that when I'm anxious, even though I would never verbalize it, I must be wondering if God knows what He's doing. If I didn't doubt His competence, why would I worry? The Bible testifies amply to the fact that God knows what He's doing. After the Israelites had taken possession of the promised land, we read in Joshua 21:45 that *not one word of all the good promises that the LORD had made to the house of Israel had failed; all came to pass.* In Isaiah 46:9-11 God says, *for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will accomplish all my purpose,' calling a bird of prey from the east, the man of my counsel from a far country. I have spoken, and I will bring it to pass; I have purposed, and I will do it.* Job says to God in Job 42:2, *"I know that You can do all things,*

*and that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted."*

Once God determines to do something, nothing can stop Him. That can't be said about us, no matter how competent we are.

In Mark 7:37, after Jesus had miraculously healed a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, we're told that the people were astonished beyond measure, and they said, *"He has done all things well."* In other words, "He's extremely competent." Romans 10:11 says, *Everyone who believes in Him will not be put to shame,* or not be disappointed. David writes in Psalm 37:25, *I have been young, and now am old, yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken or his children begging for bread.* David had never seen God fail anyone. Have you? Has God ever failed you, or anyone you know? Because of improper expectations people may think that God has failed them, but He never has and never will fail to carry out what is best for His people. As the familiar verse Romans 8:28 puts it, *And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose.*

The next time you're tempted to be anxious, remind yourself that God knows what He's doing. He's never made a mistake, He's never made a wrong move, He's never needed a "do-over," and He never will. He has and always will have a perfect track record; we can have full confidence in Him.
