FAITH: A Way of Life?

Do you like surprises? Most people appreciate the thoughtfulness and fun of coming into a room with people jumping out from behind the couch to say "Surprise! Happy Birthday!" However, having a stranger jump out from behind a tree in the middle of the night, clobbering you on the head would not be your idea of a nice surprise. Under most circumstances, **we like to know what is around the corner or up ahead.** We like to map our own way so that we will not get lost or come up on any unwelcomed surprises.

In these circumstances we set the course and put our faith and trust in our own ability to navigate

through the currents of life. There are just a few problems with this. **We often give God little room to take us to surprising territories and very little faith is required along the journey.**

It is comfortable when we make the plans and a bit scary when we do not always know where we are going or what faith stretching difficulties we may encounter. But I believe this is where God most often wants to find us - willing individuals, willing families, and a willing church to take a step of faith simply because God wants us to.

When I read *Fresh Faith* by Jim Cymbala I was challenged to evaluate my level of true dependence on God.

Who is in control? Him or me? Do we have the faith that can move mountains, change a generation, stand boldly alone, fight for our families, and reach out to a lost and hurting community? These may be difficult to see, but not impossible to grasp. It takes the faith of a "mustard-seed."

So then, if "faith is . . . certain of what

we do not see" (Heb 11:1) why do we lack confidence and contentment when we do

People say "I have faith", but when it comes down to it people often chicken out and miss the blessing God has in store for those who truly trust Him. To have faith is more than a belief system it is also a way of life.

not always see clearly what the Lord has in store for us as individuals, families, or a church? We often say we have faith, but when it comes down to it we chicken out and miss the blessing God has in store for those who truly trust Him. I believe God is looking for individuals and congregations to live with true faith, living like Abraham, Noah, Moses, and David. It won't be easy, but it is the best place – right in the palm of God's hand. **Lord, deepen our faith and help us to put it to practice.**

Getting the Word Out

Joyful Obedience

There's a big difference between obedience and joyful obedience; just ask any parent or supervisor. In 2 Corinthians 8 the apostle Paul commends the joyful obedience of the Macedonian Christians in their giving to a collection that Paul was taking among the Gentile Christians for the Jewish Christians in Judea. Paul writes, *We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints- and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us.* 2 Corinthians 8:1-5.

The Macedonian Christians were extremely poor people, and yet they gave beyond what they could afford (and this before credit cards!). However, Paul's focus was not on how much the Macedonians gave relative to their situation, but on the fact that they gave with joy. How could they give so joyfully? It was because of the grace of God. In the first verse Paul says, *"We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia."* Paul is writing about God's grace more than about the Macedonians. Paul is not putting the Macedonians on a pedestal; he's putting God on a pedestal. The Macedonians had a good grasp of the grace of God, and that motivated them to joyful obedience. Why is that?

When we realize what God has done for us in Christ through His grace, and that God's grace will always be more than sufficient for every need we have, that frees us to give ourselves to others. God has our back, so to speak. In Exodus 20 God prefaced the Ten Commandments by saying, *"I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery."* (verse 2). In other words, because He's the kind of God who can and will rescue His people and meet their needs, they don't have to do such things as murder, steal or covet. The author of Hebrews writes, *Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for He has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we can confidently say, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear; what can man do to me?"* Hebrews 13:5-6.

What can keep us from obeying God joyfully is the thought that if we obey, we'll miss out on something good; e.g., someone may get mad at us for doing what's right, or we won't have enough "me" time, or we'll run out of money. But when we realize that at God's right hand there are *"pleasures forevermore"* (Psalm 16:11), and that His goodness and lovingkindness will *pursue* us (literal translation) all the days of our lives (Psalm 23:6), then we're free to obey with happy abandon. What is the difference between obedience and joyful obedience? The grace of God.
